Have a Christmas market and purchase Christmas cookies, crafts, and used books;

Develop prayer shawl and baptismal blanket ministries;

Host a brat sale;

Plan "Loving Lunches" for children when there is no school;

Sponsor and provide space for a club house for childcare before and after school;

Develop a prayer chain;

Volunteer to help with weekly and monthly church dinners;

Bake Christmas cookies for shut-ins;

Assist at the food pantry;

Donate to missions:

Provide money for Christmas gifts for the needy or shut-ins;

Invite guest speakers for programs at monthly meetings;

Host a Christmas Fair and invite all women of the church to participate;

Sponsor scholarships for attendees at church camps and convocations;

Assist in local charitable projects;

Host a retreat;

Plan potlucks for special UMW projects; and invite everyone from the church;

Include some social events for fun;

Sell "treasures" at rummage sales;

Provide funeral lunches:

Invite churches from the surrounding area to a "Friends 'Night" event;

Provide scholarships for women and high school students;

Nurture the congregation by sending cards or notes and raise joys and concerns during worship;

Make hats for Head Start children;

Initiate social events such as boat rides and tours.
