I have brought home a table loom to make bed mats. I purchased it at Midwest Mission in Illinois. It reminds me of the loom my grandson used to make potholders for Christmas presents many years ago – only much bigger.

This loom is designed for anyone to make sleeping mats for those that need a barrier between them and the ground. It is an excellent way to recycle plastic grocery bags. We cut them to make "plarn". (plastic yarn).

There is a short video on the Midwest Mission web page -midwestmission.org/loom. Please take a look at it. It shows how to cut the bags, and set up the loom before weaving. WE will demonstrate how to do this at Turtle Lake on April 27<sup>th</sup>. Then UWF units may borrow it for one month and try it out to see if you might want to purchase your own. The cost to purchase is \$100.

As the first Disciples took very little with them, they might have liked a mat for sleeping. This is a way we can help the homeless and also decrease the plastic in the land-fill. Our way of taking care of the earth.

You can distribute the mats locally or send them to Midwest Missions and they will put them in the shipments they send out.

I trust that God will use this gift to bring healing, love and fellowship as we work together.

## A Message from our Social Action Coordinator... Laura Ida

Spring Greetings from your Social Action Coordinator! It is so wonderful to be writing this as green sprouts are peaking out! I hope you find the gifts of spring refreshing and renewing!

Whenever I see my 5-year-old granddaughter, I am greeted with a burst of enthusiasm and positive energy. As I enter, she runs forth screaming, "Grandma Laura!" and I am embraced with a huge hug. I have noticed that her beautiful, happy spirit spreads to whoever is near, smiles all around! I was reminded of the gift of this greeting when listening to our presenter during Social Action Day. He asked a question (credited to Toni Morrison), "Does your face light up when your kids walk in the room?" My granddaughter gives me this gift, and it is a reminder to me to return this gift whenever I encounter a child. Our first speaker, the Hon/Rev Everett Mitchell reminded us of this important simple practice, in contrast to all of the trauma and negative reactions children experience.

Our Social Action Day "wowed" me!! So much good information, and such impressive speakers! This presentation was recorded, I hope your units will access it! I can only try to highlight a small bit of the information! Judge Mitchell of Dane county (who also pastors a Baptist congregation) works passionately to reduce trauma with young people. Youth are unshackled before they are brought into his courtroom and treated with dignity. He emphasizes that troubled youth are not and never were inferior, and as a Judge he tells young people, "I am your reflection." A victim of abuse himself, Judge Mitchell believes that a spiritual experience at the age of 15 and teachers who helped him finally learn to read gave him the hope and resilience needed to excel to his position today.

Our second Social Action Day speaker was Peggy West-Schroeder formerly a Milwaukee City board supervisor and now the Director of FREE. Peggy spoke of the alarming growing number of incarcerated women and the disproportionate experiences of lifelong trauma, abuse and co-occurring disorders. FREE offers a space to support one another as well as VOICE to women who were directly impacted by incarceration. Peggy was born while her mother was incarcerated and does not know where she was the first six weeks of her life, but then was fortunate to be fostered and adopted by a wonderful family. She reminded us that not everyone has a positive story such as hers.

A suggestion Peggy has for our units was to contact local jails and prisons about needs for women when they are released. Hygiene bags, clothing, a tote or large cloth bag to put belongings in could be both helpful and provide a little dignity as women leave this environment. 47% of women released from prison are homeless.

<u>A Knock at Midnight</u> by Brittany Barnett is an excellent book on our United Women of Faith Reading list highlighting the indignities and injustice suffered by incarcerated women. I recommend it!

Kathy Hartke, our State Social Action Coordinator and medical doctor shared the difficulties of incarcerated pregnant women. She also urged us to write our senators to address the problem of "obstetrical birth deserts" in rural areas of WI. Please LISTEN to the recording that will be available soon! As I mentioned earlier, there is so much information!

As the book of Micah reminds us, what does the Lord require of us? But to do Justice, and to love kindness, so that we may walk humbly with our God! Peace to you!

I hope and pray that those of us gathered for this event will have left feeling encouraged and nurtured by spending time sharing worship and ideas.
