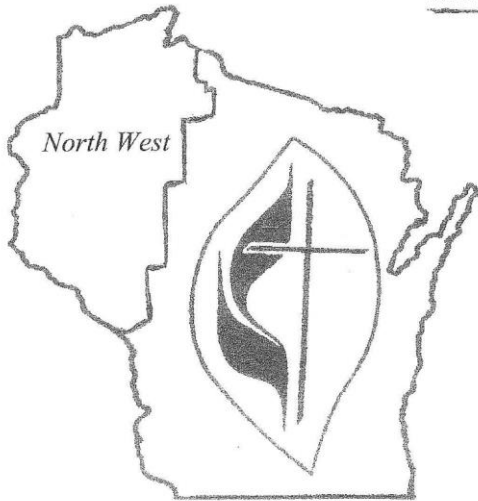

United Methodist Women is now United Women in Faith! The move is part of a refreshing of the organization that includes a new logo and an array of new and improved programs to nurture current members and welcome new women to join to put their love in action on behalf of women, children, and youth.

The organization announced the new operating name in the March-April edition of response, its bimonthly magazine for members, and launched the rebrand with a new website during a [Facebook event](#) on March 3, 2022.

The new programs are fruits of research conducted over the past five years with more than 24,000 United Methodists and women of other Christian traditions participating in the surveys, focus groups and interviews. This input informed the prayerful discernment of staff and elected leaders.

The changes are designed to address the different needs and life stages of current members and new women and expand options for membership and engagement. The new name also aims to welcome current members whose local churches may choose to disaffiliate from The United Methodist Church as well as women of other faith traditions who want to join.

**A Message from our North West District Team's Social Action
Coor.....Laura Ida**

Greetings United Women in Faith!

In our busy and ever-changing world, there are always opportunities for Social Action! A few recent highlights in Social Action include learning about the Afghan Refugee Response from Rev. Peder Johanson during our Spring Day of Enrichment in March and the recent Day of Action in April connecting with our WI Native American Sisters.

Rev. Johanson who serves as the Volunteer Coordinator of the Afghan Refugee Response of the WI Council of Churches explained the resettlement efforts in WI and the various ways churches are assisting. Our new Afghan neighbors are considered "Humanitarian Parolees" and will need to gain "refugee" status. Our voices may be needed to help expedite legislation to expedite this legal path for our new neighbors. He also spoke of the great numbers (90 million) people who are displaced globally, whether by war, climate change or other trauma and violence.

Mission Action Day included 3 outstanding Oneida Nation women who spoke about historical trauma, health care disparities and violence against Native American/Alaskan Native women and girls in Wisconsin. There were 137 participants statewide with half of the registrants joining by Zoom at home, while half joined one of the virtual watch parties. I am aware of watch parties at Eau Claire Lake Street, and Osceola UMC in our district. The entire program was recorded so everyone will be available to view it soon or use parts of it for a program at their churches. Our Conference Social Action Coordinator, Kathy Hartke will be sending future Action Alerts so that United Women in Faith can take action and have their voices heard!!

An immediate recommended action we can take is to ask our WI legislators to Co-sponsor the Into the Light ActS3824 (for Maternal Mental Health and Substance Use Disorders). We can also continue to honor Native Americans by reading, Not Your Princess: Voices of Native American Women (from the UMW reading list). We can also view Kind Hearted Woman, a documentary portraying the true story of a contemporary Native American woman living in two worlds (available through the public library system) or Ta Ata a film available on Netflix based on a true story of a woman who traverses cultural barriers to achieve fame as an actress and a Native American storyteller.

I hope you will join me in prayerfully considering how you are called to action!

"Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." (Matthew 25:40)

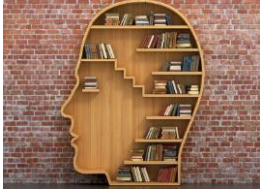
