Being June already, the main thing on their agenda is their Junteenth festival which includes so many activities and events, entertainment and vendors. This will be the 53rd year that Northcott has been so involved in the event. The event commemorates June 19, 1965 when federal troops arrived in Galveston,TX and ensured that all enslaved people were freed.

In the May/June response magazine, page 11 is a great article written about the Juneteenth celebration at Northcott/Milwaukee area. It was written by Vanessa Johnson, Development Director for Northcott. She did a wonderful job of describing the event. Below is listed some of the fun events of the Juneteenth event in case you aren't able to see the response article. On June 19, 2024, Northcott will host the annual Juneteenth Parade and Celebration. More than 50,000 are expected to attend.

They had 100 entries in the parade last year. As many or even more are expected this year. Also includes hundreds of vendors, national and local talent is expected to perform. Vanessa also thanked the United Women in Faith for all our support for the behind-the scenes items--safety barricades, sanitation and security.

Recycle Socks and Raise Funds for Northcott Neighborhood House

Recycling clean, used socks seemed like an easy thing to do, and most people have a lot of them. You may have read about it in The Green Team Times, a newspaper sent out by Josie Gobel from First UMC in Madison. A company called Gildan, makers of GOLDTOE® socks, had begun this initiative with TerraCycle. Anyone can collect clean, used socks of any brand to send to TerraCycle to recycle. Every shipment of socks sent in earns reward points based on weight. You earn 100 TerraCycle reward points per pound of socks. These reward points can then be donated to Northcott Neighborhood House.

We will be collecting the socks at the South West District Annual Gathering.

There are two positive outcomes with doing this project. You are earning funds for Northcott Neighborhood House, and it will keep hundreds of pounds of old used socks out of our landfills!

Mabel Heil Scholarship Fund Wisconsin Conference

Mabel Heil Scholarships are made possible by earnings from a trust established in the will of Sarah Mabel Heil, a resident of Cuba City, Wisconsin. Funds are awarded by the Heil Scholarship Committee of the Wisconsin Conference United Women in Faith and are invested in the Wisconsin United Methodist Foundation. Any Wisconsin United Methodist woman working to improve her education may apply.

Available Funds:

a. Funds will be invested in the Wisconsin United Methodist Foundation, in a fund split 60 percent equity and 40 percent fixed.

b. Funds available to provide scholarships for each semester will be calculated as 2.5 percent of the fair market value of the Mabel Heil Scholarship Fund as of the end of the month prior to the approval of Scholarships.

Eligibility Requirements:

a. Must be a female member of the United Women in Faith and/or United Methodist Church in Wisconsin.

b. Submit a written answer to the question, "In what ways do I consider myself a worthy student?"

c. Letter of recommendation from either the president of the local UWFaith unit or from your pastor.

d. Letter of recommendation from a church member who is not a member of your household and is not a relative. (Person writing letter on behalf of applicant is to send the letter directly to the contact person)

e. All letters must be written (Preferably typed) on one side of an 8.5x11" sheet of white paper using black ink.

Application Procedures:

a. Awarded for one semester at a time. To be considered again for any subsequent semester, send a letter asking to be considered.

b. Graduate students may apply for each semester as long as they meet the other requirements

c. Application and two (2) letters of recommendation OR RECONSIDERATION LETTER must be received by May 1 for the fall semester or October 1 for the spring semester. Checks will be disbursed by August 15 and January 15.
